There was some very good news. The surgery is now a Level 3 surgery with regard to research projects. This means that there are at least 13 or 14 studies happening. This requires a lot of work and commitment from Dr Coleman and this was appreciated by the group. In addition to the work in the surgery this has meant supporting other surgeries I n their research projects. PPG involvement is also a factor. Finance accrues to the surgery for the extra work in two instalments. The second one has just been paid following successful monitoring. To progress to a Level 4 research surgery would mean recruiting 1% of the patients on to studies. It was felt that this was quite a strange criterion, the surgery not having any impact on the nature of the studies which are brought forward to recruit patients.

Some of studies that the surgery was involved in were:

- BEE study looked at the treatment of childhood eczema which emollient was best. The study is now over and the findings are yet to be published. These findings might have an impact on future NICE guidelines. Prof Kim Thomas at Nottingham University is involved.
- PPG members are involved in the PINCER programme through completing a questionnaire or interview to look at auditing the safe prescribing of medicines. It's a check to ensure that correct medicines are being prescribed as well as correct combinations of medicines. The PPG on Wednesday February 5th at 18.30 is the time when members of the PPG will be taking part in a focus group to get some of our thoughts about the study.
- Genetic links to anxiety and depression. This is the GLAD study and is a nationwide on line questionnaire that patients can self-refer. The website is www.gladstudy.org.uk.
- The surgery has expressed an interest in the CHICO Caring for Children with Coughs –
 project. The aim here is to find ways to improve the treatment and care of children with
 coughs and acute respiratory tract infections who attend GP surgeries. Is there any impact
 by prescribing antibiotics. But here the surgery is assigned to usual care: so nothing extra for
 our patients during the trial.
- Other current studies. Mental health for people with hearing loss. Type 2 diabetes in overweight men (DeLiver) with an exercise programme.

There was a discussion about feedback, or lack of, to participants to find out the results.
