Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> June 2019 6.30pm Prof Belinda Winder on the problem of sexual abuse today - and how we can keep communities safe.

Belinda is Professor in Forensic Psychology and Heads the Sexual Offences, Crime and Misconduct Research Unit at Nottingham Trent University and gave us a brilliant insight into the world of sexual offending.

The impact on every aspect of an abused person's life is enormous. Victim statements can be harrowing. But the way such crime is reported and dealt with by society is also having a detrimental impact on our children in particular. They are taught "stranger danger" and retained within the home environment, leading to a lack of exercise and obesity. 80% of sexual offending takes place in the home. Again 80% of crimes have no previous offence and only 7-8% re-offend.

There are many factors that contribute to a person becoming a person with sexual offending convictions. Isolation, early sexualisation, inappropriate home circumstances, early sexualisation, issues of power. Not all those who offend against children are paedophiles and not all paedophiles go on to carry out crimes.

Five years ago, Belinda was instrumental in setting up a charity called Safer Living Foundation <u>http://saferlivingfoundation.org/</u> which uniquely is a collaboration between a university (Trent) and a prison (HMP Whatton). Among their initiatives are: Circles of Support and Accountability (to help those convicted be less isolated), the Aurora Project (signposting, support and therapy service for individuals) and the Corbett community Centre.

Safer Living Foundation has opportunities for volunteering and we could display a poster about the Aurora project in our waiting room. Belinda offered to return in six months and tell us of progress.
