1. What happens when a patient moves out of our practice area

Mary Simpson (practice manager) gave us a thorough overview (see.. for more details). Things that came out of this were:

There is no discrimination.

Our surgery is not part of the optional government scheme which allows patients to choose to use surgeries outside their catchment area.

If you are ill whilst temporarily out of the area (eg on holiday) you can register as a temporary resident.

Children's healthcare when divorced parents share caring but live in two different surgery catchment areas could be a problem.

Drug or alcoholic abusers might be tempted to attempt to obtain painkillers etc from multiple surgeries. This relies on GP's skill to spot it and there is no formal system. There is good co-operation between surgeries locally and an informal alert may sometimes be sent.

2. Best and worst surgeries in Nottinghamshire

Rose Thompson brought this to our attention. As expected practices in wealthier areas topped the list. Any practice that got less than 50 responses from patients was excluded. In my experience that could effectively exclude quite a few people with learning disabilities. Many of our Black and Minority Ethnic service users appear to have undiagnosed dyslexia, or were excluded from education at an early age. Basic reading and writing can still be a challenge, particularly in deprived local Wards. Not sure if the questions were produced in other languages either.

Not sure how useful these lists really are given the challenges of including as many diverse service users as possible. And they do not reflect such things as Care Quality Commission visits.
