Background to Healthwatch

Community Health Councils were set up in 1974 and were successful at holding chief executives of local authorities to account. But were abolished in 2000. Their role was passed on to IINKs and PALs and now they have been superseded by Healthwatch.

Healthwatch are not allowed to advertise apart from their website

<u>http://healthwatchnottingham.co.uk/</u>. Each week they have "Talk to Us" stands at various places Mary Potter Health Centre, Asda and Clifton Health Centre. They are always looking for volunteers (see the item in the news section).

Healthwatch is minimally staffed with Pete McGavin as the Chief Executive, a communications person and a volunteer co-ordinator. It is not political. Healthwatch cannot pursue an individual patient's complaints but the is an organisation called Power which can do this: <u>http://www.pohwer.net/</u>

Discussions were wide ranging and included:

- Dementia diagnosis. NICE says that a patient should be signposted to sources of support at the time they are given a diagnosis of dementia. Healthwatch Nottingham are about to publish their investigation which found that this does not always happen.
- The BME community are on a steep learning curve on dementia because immigration disrupted usual community awareness since the older generation was often left behind in the "old" country.
- Sustainablitly and transformation plans for city health have been submitted for approval but remain secret. These plans are tasked with saving £450 million in Nottingham alone.

Agreed actions:

The group agreed they would like Healthwatch to return for a session with us every year.
