- 1. How to distribute information about our meetings to patients who do not have access to the internet.

- 2. Local closures of GP Surgeries. Some concern was raised about the possibility of there being lots of new patients from the closure of the Mapperley Park practice, the Willows and one in Top Valley. What might the knock-on impact for Elmswood Surgery. It appears that there is a significant group of mobile young professionals with a high turnover. This means that there will be little increase in numbers. The total number of patients being slightly above the 9000 mark.
- 3. **GP Recruitment**. By April 2017 there will be a replacement for Dr Bloor who is retiring. There was a discussion about the disincentives of GP's becoming full time: long hours, admin, high insurance costs. Being part time often suited as a good work/life balance.
- 4. The surgery's phone lines are now open from 08.00 hrs.
- 5. Dr Shankar is now on the local CCG.
- 6. **Wound care**. There was an example cited of someone being discharged too early from hospital post-cancer operation. It was pointed out that the surgery has a good wound care service provided by the experienced nurses. However, the surgery is closed at the weekends so patients have to go to the walk in centre for dressings. The home bound patients are covered at weekends by the on call district nurses.
