# ELMSWOOD HEALTH CENTRE PATIENT PARTICIPATION GROUP MEETING

Friday 10<sup>th</sup> April 2015 2pm Rose Thompson, with Elijah, on the outcomes of the "Hear me Now" prostate cancer report

Rose explained how she came to set up BME Cancer Communities which serves Black and Minority Ethnic Groups (including Irish, Traveller and low income households). Prostate Cancer has a greater effect on BME than the general population. It shows up 5 years earlier in this group and incidence is increasing (whereas it is reducing in the general population). This could be to do with lack of awareness, incomplete family health histories and differences in the way the problems are communicated to the doctor.

The only available test is a blood one which is not always reliable – giving false positives. This means that it is not any use as a screening tool for the general population. But more useful for the BME community – because of the higher incidence.

Early treatment gives the best survival chances and current methods have less side effects on erectile function etc.

The high profile "Hear Me Now" campaign organised by Rose, which has had two awareness events at the Houses of Parliament has had a great impact on BME Communities already. Elijah told us his story – he had no symptoms and it was hearing about the risks from Rose which caused him to press for a test. This led to a diagnosis of an early but quite aggressive prostate cancer which has been treated and he has the "all clear".

Rose is hoping to get funding for a drop-in centre in Nottingham. Three other cities are ear- marked for drop-in centres – London, Leeds and Birmingham. It is Birmingham which has least awareness at the moment.
